Old Business:

- Update on Facades Project and Transfer of Funds from Streetscape Portion of Project – Funding in the amount of \$24,881.19 remains from the Streetscape Project and a request to move the funds to the Facade Project was approved. These funds will be applied to the southside of the Facade Project that will be advertised for bids June or July 2020. Randy Sturgill, Building Official, reported the westside of the north buildings are 95% complete. Once complete the Contractor will move on to the southside of the north buildings. Funds have depleted for the current north side of the Facade Project. The Town recently spent \$5,000 for Engineering for the design work. The Facade Project Management Team is scheduled to meet in June 2020.
- Notice of Joint Meeting with Town and County on May 19th at 4:00 p.m. – On the third Tuesday of each month a meeting will be held at the Smyth County Office Building. Smyth County representatives as well as representatives from each Locality will attend. From the Town of Chilhowie John Clark, Town Manager and Councilmembers Donna Blevins and Brent Foster will attend the meeting.
- Review of 2020-2021 Budget Proposal and Authorize Public Hearing for June 11, 2020 – Water and Sewer rate increase was reviewed, and the rate increase will not become effective until January 1, 2021. Town employees will not receive a merit increase upon annual evaluations. During a previous meeting Council inquired about placing tracking devices on Town vehicles. The cost is \$17.95 per vehicle per month and a one-time fee of \$29.95 per unit for activation for a total of \$703.50 for the first month for ten vehicles and \$179.50 each month thereafter. The tracking devices are on a ten second delay and can generate reports that state mileage, fuel, speed, location, and engine idling. Council may choose which vehicles receive the tracking device.

Concerning proposed purchases under Capital Outlay, all purchasing will be postponed until January 1, 2021. Fire and EMS Department has recently applied for grant funding to assist with purchasing a vehicle. The Fire and EMS Department will not order the vehicle until the status of the grant funds are known. If grant funds are awarded the vehicle will not be required to be amortized. The \$15,000 budgeted for playground equipment during

the Budget Workshop Council advised to cut the playground equipment line item. The budget was balanced with the playground line item included. Council requested the \$15,000 be placed back in the budget and the money shall be set aside to accrue over the next three to five years to purchase playground equipment.

- Introduction of New Police Officer Mr. Gabe Prater - Steve Price, Police Chief, introduced Gabe Prater who was recently hired for the Police Department. Mr. Prater will begin the Police Academy July 2020.
- Update on Reopening Farmer's Market and Possible Dedication Date – The Farmer's Market is proposed to open June 4, 2020 in full guidance of Governor's Executive Orders. It was suggested to waive the Vendor fee of \$5.00 for this season due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Dedication of the Farmer's Market may be scheduled for the middle to late summer to allow time for sewer installation and the restrooms to be completed.

report is completed on an annual basis and posted at the Post Office, Chilhowie Library, Municipal Building and www.chilhowie.org. The 2019 Annual Drinking Water Report concluded with Chilhowie's water system did not have any reporting, MCL or TT violations during 2019.

Chief Haynes reported he has been contacted by two individuals who expressed interest in purchasing the truck and requested permission to advertise the truck for sealed bids.
