**Old Business:**

- Council Staff Response to Public Hearing and Selection of Date to Adopt Budget – Republic Services recently notified the Town of a garbage rate increase of 3.0%. The proposed budget estimated an expense of \$143,000 for the 2020-2021 fiscal year. The proposed 3.0% rate increase is \$4,290 for a total garbage expense of \$147,290 for the 2020-2021 fiscal year.

- Review of Bids on Equipment – A notice for a request for bids was advertised in the Smyth County News and on the Town’s Website [www.chilhowie.org](http://www.chilhowie.org). The bids included an operational 1991 Mack heavy rescue truck, a nonoperational John Deere tractor, a nonoperational 1995 Chevy, a 1989 Ford F700 cab and frame only and a riding mower in fair shape. The bids were due Monday, June 8, 2020 at 3 p.m. and opened at that time. The total bid amount for equipment sold is \$7,930.55.

- Update on Phase I of Downtown Facades Project and Beginning of Phase II and Pay Request No. 2 – Phase I included the completion of a sidewalk and hand railing on Town property. The cedar over -hang was recently removed and found glass behind it. The glass will be worked on as well as brick pointing. The Chilhowie Hardware and Piggly Wiggly sign will be highlighted and placed back.

Beginning of Phase II, a non-mandatory pre-bid conference was held on June 3, 2020. The meeting was attended by Town staff members, Dennis Amos of Hurt and Proffitt, Angela

Wolfe of Mount Rogers Planning District Commission and one contractor from Wallberg Construction who is currently working on Phase I of the project. Bid opening date is July 1, 2020 at 11:00 a.m.

Pay Request Number 2 consists of \$11,043.75 to Walberg Construction, \$2,000 to Mount Rogers Planning Commission for administration cost and labor compliance and \$1,687.50 to Hurt and Proffitt for engineering services provided for a total of \$14,731.25.

- Presentation of May Library Report – A representative for the Smyth County Library was not present. The Library Report for May was included in Council’s packet.

**New Business:**

- Discussion of Virginia Risk Management Association 2020-2021 Insurance Renewal – The Town’s total liability insurance premium which includes cyber liability coverage and biosolids coverage and a 4.2% rate increase is in the amount of \$117,068.32.
- Update on Farmer’s Market Opening – The Farmer’s Market opened June 4, 2020. Vendors are required to wear mask and gloves. Patrons are to practice social distancing. Three vendors attended the first market with an estimation of fifty patrons. One vendor was present during the second opening of the Market. Ron Cahill, Farmer’s Market Manger, stated he will travel to surrounding markets and hand out business cards to other vendors to advertise the new Farmer’s Market structure.

- Update on Reopening Town Hall and Fire Administration Building – During a Pre-Bid Conference held Wednesday, June 3, 2020 the front door of the Town Hall was unlocked to allow those in that were participating in the Pre-Bid Conference and customers began to enter the building to make payments. At that time the door was left unlocked. Protective gear is available to the employees.

The Community Room, Old High School and shelters at the Recreation Park are not being rented at this time. Further instructions from the Virginia Governor is needed prior to reopening those facilities.

- Update on Chamber of Commerce Headquarters Location – The Town of Marion is not continuing funding for the Chamber of Commerce of Smyth County. Ms. Sarah Gillespie, Executive Director of the Chamber of Commerce of Smyth County, submitted a letter of request to the Town of Chilhowie requesting office space at the H.L. Bonham Tourism Center that would be utilized several times per week as a work and meeting space. The Chamber is offering to pay one quarter of the utilities at the facility.

The current lease agreement with the Smyth County Tourism Association reads the Tourism Association has control of inside of the building. Mr. John Clark, Town Manager feels that can be negotiated.

Motion by Brent Foster, second by Alan Counts Council authorizes the Town Manager to negotiate a lease with the Chamber of Commerce of Smyth County. The motion was approved with following recorded vote:

- Announcement of Arrival of New Ambulance – The new ambulance has been delivered and equipment is currently being installed. The ambulance shall be in service July 1, 2020.

**Department Reports:**

Mrs. Marlene Henderson, Clerk-Treasurer, reported according to the revenue analysis for May 2020 Meals Tax revenue is down by \$3,000. Other revenues are staying close to the same prior to COVID 19 pandemic.

Emily Dungan, Councilwoman, inquired as to what the Police Department is doing as far as looking into the use of force procedure policy. Stephen Price, Police Chief, reported the policy is in accordance with the Department of Criminal Justice Services Accreditation Standards which is reviewed once a year by the Department of Criminal Justice Services.

Mr. Ron Cahill, Recreation/Special Events Coordinator, requested direction as to how to move forward with Recreation Sports. Mr. Cahill reviewed some information the Virginia High School League is releasing concerning High School Sports.

**Any Other Council Business:**

Mr. John Clark, Town Manager, reported Rural Development has contacted him stating the possibility of grant funds in the amount of \$50,000 coming open for Fire Trucks with long term financing up to twenty (20) years. Rural Development also stated grant funds up to 55% for Police cars will be available in the near future. Both grant opportunities will be investigated. Brent Foster, Councilman, suggested to entertain the idea of refurbished or demo fire trucks instead of purchasing a new fire truck. The existing trucks do not have a lot of miles on them nor a lot of operational hours.
