- Joining the Mount Rogers Planning District Commission Cigarette Tax Board – Mrs. Marlene Henderson presented the following:

**PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE- TOWN OF CHILHOWIE
PROPOSED ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH A JOINT ENTITY
TO BE KNOWN AS THE MT. ROGERS CIGARETTE TAX BOARD**

The Town Council of the Town of Chilhowie, Virginia will conduct a public hearing on April 8, 2021 at 7:00 p.m. to receive public comments on a proposed ordinance which would create a joint

entity, to be known as the Mt. Rogers Cigarette Tax Board, pursuant to Virginia Code Section 15.2-1300 et seq. The purpose of the Board would be to jointly administer the collection, accounting and enforcement of any cigarette taxes adopted by the Town of Chilhowie, Virginia, and those of any other member locality. The proposed ordinance would further authorize the execution of the joint exercise agreement setting forth the powers, duties, membership, and other matters pertinent to the newly established board. The joint exercise agreement would be effective upon approval of at least two (2) localities within the Mt. Rogers Planning District Commission. The region consists of the Counties of Bland, Carroll, Grayson, Smyth, Washington, Wythe, and all Towns within, and the Cities of Bristol and Galax.

Paul Cassell The answer to your question sir is that it does not cost anything, but what it does it administers the cigarette tax for all Localities and then pro rata share the cost that associates with that. So, it is divided evenly between the Towns based on the number of stamps sold is the way the agreement reads. There is a cost to the extent we will not administer cigarette tax anymore it will be administered by this entity that will do it for all which we expect to be substantially cheaper than the Town will pay its fair share based on sells.

Old Business:

- Council Comments/Actions Following Public Hearing – All three Localities within Smyth County plan to join the Mount Rogers Cigarette Tax Board. The goal is a uniform cigarette tax rate of \$0.40, currently the Town’s cigarette tax rate is \$0.08. Mount Rogers has reported the estimated start date for this Board is January 1, 2022.

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING THE FORMATION OF JOINT ENTITY TO BE KNOWN AS THE MOUNT ROGERS CIGARETTE TAX BOARD AND BESTOWING ON SUCH ENTITY ALL POWERS NECESSARY AND PROPER FOR THE PERFORMAMCE OF ITS DUTIES AS PROVIDED BY LAW

WHEREAS, pursuant to the authority granted to localities under § 15.2-1300 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended, the Council of the Town of Chilhowie has determined that it would serve the public interest to establish a joint entity to be known as the Mount Rogers Cigarette Tax Board (the “Board”) in order to efficiently administer the collection, accounting, disbursement, compliance monitoring and enforcement of cigarette taxes assessed by the localities desiring to join the Board; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the Town of Chilhowie has reviewed an agreement establishing the Board and defining its’ powers, duties and other procedures, the text of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein as “Exhibit A,” and is in agreement with the terms as set forth therein; and,

WHEREAS, the aforementioned agreement provides that it shall become effective upon the approval by the governing bodies of at least two (2) localities within the Mount Rogers Planning District and the execution of said agreement by their authorized and execution of said agreement by their authorized representatives; and,

WHEREAS, the Council of the Town of Chilhowie wishes to authorize the formation of the Mount Rogers Cigarette Tax Board as a member thereof and authorize the execution of said agreement by the April 8, 2021 on its behalf.

NOW WHEREFORE, the Council of the Town of Chilhowie hereby ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

1. Under authority of 15.2-1300, and upon the approval and execution of two (2) or more localities within the Mount Rogers Planning District, there is hereby created and

established the Mount Rogers Cigarette Tax Board, which shall act as the agent of the localities for the administration of their respective cigarette tax ordinances.

2. The agreement, attached hereto as Exhibit A, is hereby APPROVED and the Mayor and Town Manager is authorized to execute that same on behalf of the governing body; and,
3. The powers and authority of the Board, as set forth in the agreement are hereby APPROVED.

- Presentation of 2020 Fire/Emergency Medical Services Report – Mr. David Haynes, Fire and EMS Chief, presented the 2020 Fire/Emergency Medical Services Report. The 2020 Fire/Emergency Medical Services Report contains the same information as previous years in a different format. During 2020 there were a slight decrease in the overall call volume due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Fire and EMS Department did not conduct as many community out-reach programs in person but utilized social media outlets during 2020.
- Report on Delinquency Relief from CARES Act Funding – The Town received COVID-19 funds in the amount of \$6,246.69 from Smyth County to assists water and sewer customers who were delinquent. Letters announcing this assistance was sent to all delinquent water and sewer customers. Twenty-three customers responded and requested the assistance with their bill. The COVID-19 funds were divided equally between the twenty-three residents and each received \$271.60 credited toward their water and sewer account.
- Update on East Lee Highway Pedestrian Project II – Design work has begun for the East Lee Highway Pedestrian Project II. Thompson and Litton submitted two alternatives for

the proposed sidewalk on Second Street. The landowner was presented with both alternatives and they selected Alternative I. Bids for the project is estimated to be held in September or October 2021.

- Update on Downtown Facades Phase II Project – Work has begun on the Downtown Facades Phase II Project and is going well. Awnings have been installed at the cost of the property owners. The Contractor is currently working on the back side if the Berry’s Home Center building repointing and painting the brick. No pay request is requested at this time.
- Permission to Bid Lyons Gap Road Project and Schedule – The project will include 940 feet of water line at the cost of \$11per foot that will be installed on the east side of the roadway. Two easements are required for this project. The project bid is for labor only, the Town will purchase all material. The bid is expected to be advertised April 21st and 28th in the Smyth County News. Bid opening is expected to be May 11th and brought before Council during the May 13th meeting.

- Responses from Department of Housing and Community Development on Extension Request and Audit Submittal – Due to bidding issues and in accordance with the Town’s request the Department of Housing and Community Development is amending the contract by extending the contract termination date to March 31, 2022. The Department of Housing and Community Development also extended the deadline of receiving the Fiscal Year 2019-2020 Audit to June 30, 2021. Auditors are currently working on the Audit for Fiscal Year 2019-2020 and are aware of the submittal deadline.
- Report on Police Chief on Various Issues and First Quarter 2021 Safety Initiative Report – Mr. Andrew Moss, Chief of Police, presented the Highway Safety Initiative Quarterly Summary. Chief Moss also discussed the increase of highspeed pursuits on Interstate 81. The Police Department’s goal during a highspeed pursuit is to keep the pursuit from entering the Town’s corporate limits. The Department has ordered two additional sets of spike strips therefore every police vehicle will be equipped.

New Business:

- Public Notice on Reissuance of Pollutant Discharge Elimination Standard Permit at Sewer Treatment Plant – The reissuance of Pollutant Discharge Elimination Standard Permit is issued every five years. According to the Department of Environmental Quality the public comment period is thirty days from April 3, 2021. The notice is being published in the Smyth County News on April 3rd and April 10th. After the thirty-day comment period the permit can be reissued on May 3, 2021. Sludge cannot be applied to the secured farms until the permit is issued.
- Request from Mr. & Mrs. Quirarte on Purchasing Town Lot on River Road – Mr. and Mrs. Quirarte presented a letter to the Town requesting to purchase a Town owned property at 160 River Road. The property is less than an acre. Mr. Paul Cassell, Town Attorney, reported there is a process for a locality to sell property such as declaring the property as a surplus, the property would be subject to bid and a Public Hearing would be required. Mr. Cassell will investigate the process further and report back during the regular scheduled May 13, 2021 Council meeting.

- Resignation of Planning Commission Member Jason Czelusniak and Planning Commission Recommendation – Mr. Lynn Pease, Chairman of the Planning Commission, reported the Planning Commission met on Tuesday, April 6, 2021. Mr. Jason Czelusniak was recently appointed to the Planning Commission but has resigned due to relocating to Salem, Virginia. The Planning Commission recommends the appointment of Mr. David Blevins to fill the unexpired term of Mr. Jason Czelusniak.

- Presentation of 2020 Water Quality Report – The 2020 Water Quality Report, also known as the Consumer Confidence Report, has been completed with no violations found. The report is posted on www.chilhowie.org and each water and sewer customer has been notified how to locate the report for review.
- Update on 2021-2022 Budget Proposal and Date of Continued Budget Meeting – Mrs. Marlene Henderson, Clerk-Treasurer, and Mr. John Clark, Town Manager, have been preparing the 2021-2022 Budget to present to Council. Council chose Thursday, April 22, 2021 at 6 p.m. for the annual budget workshop.

Committee Reports:

- Finance and Personnel Committee on Town Manager Health Insurance and Junior/Senior Prom on Main Street – Mr. John Clark, Town Manager, is currently insured with the Town of Marion. Mr. Clark has become of age and is eligible for Medicare. The Town of Marion’s policy does not allow them to continue to carry Mr. Clark under their health insurance plan. Mr. Clark works thirty-two hours per week for the Town of Chilhowie and is eligible for the Town’s insurance. The health insurance provided by the Town is 80/20%, the Town pays 80% of the premium and the employee pays 20%. The Town’s portion of the insurance for Mr. Clark is \$519.20 per month for an annual expense of \$6,230.40. The Finance and Personnel Committee recommends to Council to approve the health insurance coverage for Mr. Clark.
